Product helps integrate home, private and school-based programming

With the help of educators and behavioral researchers, Watch Me Learn® has produced a new video-based curriculum to provide a tool capable of supporting full integration of a child's home, school and private programming. The new series is called About Me and You™. The first video in the series was released July 15, 2008, and the company expects to produce a new DVD every 4-6 weeks. Each features chaptered skills lessons, which are 'modeled' in three instructional levels: beginning (vocabulary), intermediate (teacher/student interaction) and advanced (generalized). Each social skills lesson is reinforced, as appropriate, through various activities, such as interactive computer games, downloadable worksheets, instructional music and lyrics, and PowerPoint programs. The first DVD volume includes skills teaching on turn taking, brushing teeth, function of rooms, table drawing, shoe tying, body parts, senses, yes/no, personal information and block design.
